Thursday sessions will be used for some activity other than soccer (see below).

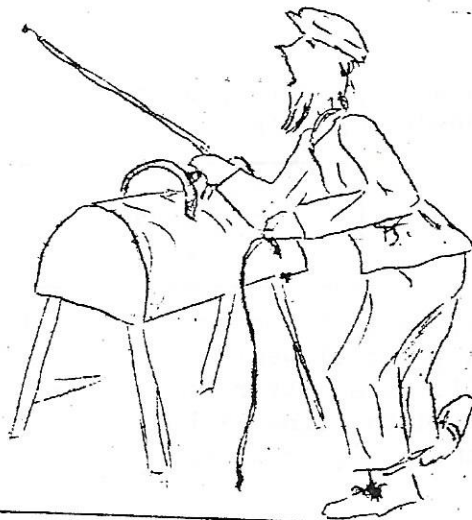

AMENDMENT

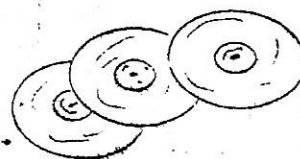

LIBRARY NEWS

There are two small exhibitions in the Library Annexe.

In the glass show cases there are exhibits from the three educational establishments that amalgamated to form Merchant Navy College. There are photographs from King Edward VII (see who you can recognise!) "Worcester" and Norwood Technical College.

Interesting exhibits include a photograph of a rowing boat, the very first boat ever owned by King Edward VII College! and photographs of the "Glen Strathallan" and the "Wendorian", both used as training ships by King Edward VII.

From the "Worcester" there are photographs of the three "Worcesters", together with a minute book of the present "Worcester". The "Worcester" was formed in 1862 as an educational establishment because of "the difficulty in providing properly qualified officers for merchant vessels". There are "Worcester" reports back to 1873; you may be interested to see the "rule of the road" or the "theory of navigation" questions set in 1873.

Norwood Technical College (now South London College) has an even longer history (and strangely a maritime benefactor). Norwood Centre for Learning was established in 1859 by Arthur Anderson (the founder of the famous P & O Company) and the "Lower Norwood Working Men's Institute" was formed "to promote the moral, intellectual and social improvement of the inhabitants residing within a 5 miles radius of Norwood Institute".

The second exhibition is on loan from Dartford District Council and is to be looked at in conjunction with the booklet "Greenhithe Conservation Area".

1. Two men on a long train journey began chatting and eventually exchanged visiting cards. One tendered the card shown here.

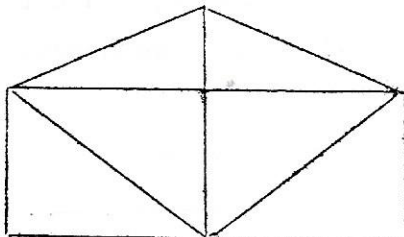
