SWEAT SHIRTS

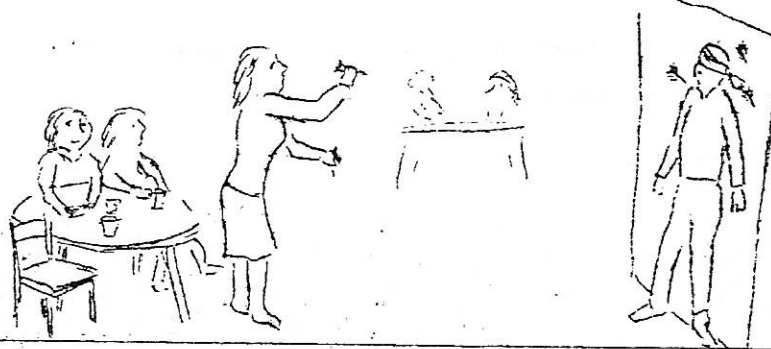

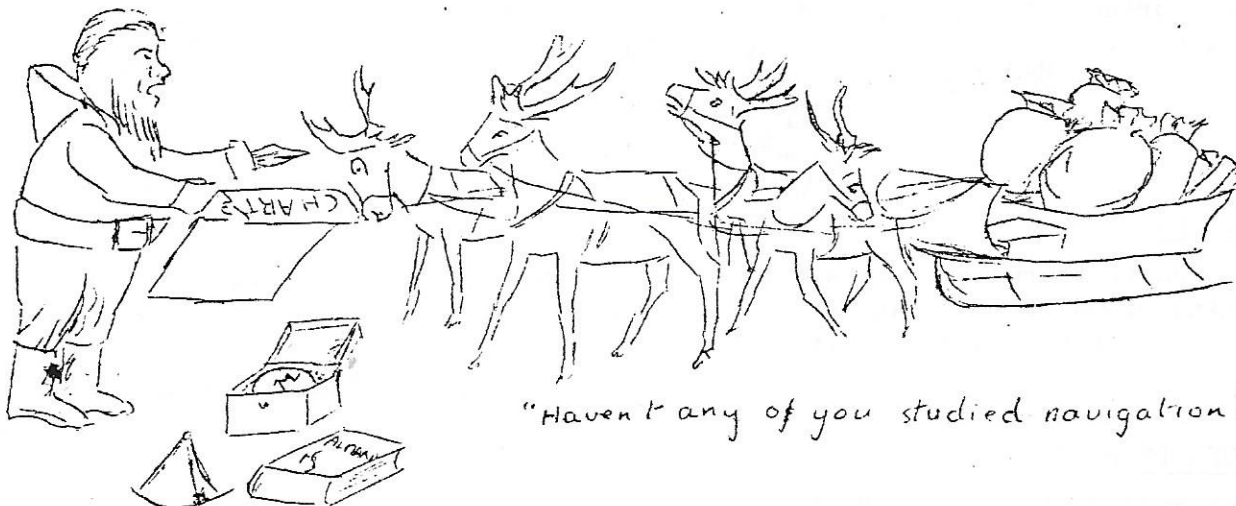
